Please also note the deadline for handing in any work done for the projects and badges.

- February 27 – **Snowmobile Party** – We invite all dads (or a substitute) to join us on this night as we enjoy an evening of snowmobile rides (ie: toboggan rides behind the snowmobile), broomball, hot chocolate and snacks. For safety reasons, we require that all boys bring and wear a helmet when on the ice and having a ride behind the snowmobile (any type of helmet is ok). ## **Project 4 – Grade 6 Boys Club Graduation Speech – Due March 13**

Project 4 for is a unique challenge for grade boys. Project 4 is an opportunity for boys to write a speech summarizing some of their best memories from their Boys Club experience (even if this is their first year). It is an opportunity for them to think back over their Boys Club experience and share what has been fun, exciting, interesting and meaningful.

To complete project 4, boys will need to write a speech that is approximately ½ page long (about 125 words). They should write about their highlights (eg: favourite activities, best memories, meaningful events) of being in Boys Club. Boys should explain why these things are highlights for them (ie: what makes these things highlights).

Boys will share their speeches with each other on March 13 and there will be opportunity for a few boys to share their speeches on achievement night.
