Overview: We need a commitment

to the regular practice of intercessory prayer. Scripture indicates that consistent (6:18), intense (6:18), and strategic (6:18-20) intercessory prayer – both individual and corporate – will in fact deliver us from the evil one. An invisible war is all around us, but so is an invisible army through prayer that can surround us in our spiritual battle. We pray knowing that we don't fight for victory – we fight from victory in Christ. Christ has already won through his work on the cross, and by this victory we can have great trust and faith in God no matter what we may face in this world. Through prayer, we are not only given the opportunity to pray for all things and with all kinds of requests, but to join in advancing the Gospel by praying for the fearlessness of the saints around the world. Prayer is a muscle that needs training.

¹⁸ And pray in the Spirit on all occasions with all kinds of prayers and requests. With this in mind, be alert and always keep on praying for all the saints.

¹⁹ Pray also for me, that whenever I open my mouth, words may be given me so that I will fearlessly make known the mystery of the gospel, ²⁰ for which I am an ambassador in chains. Pray that I may declare it fearlessly, as I should.
